Re: Access Management Plan 2026 for the Logan Lake Community Forest

Dear community members and recreation enthusiasts,

The Logan Lake Community Forest (LLCF) has completed a new Access Management Plan. The purpose of this plan is to identify roads within the LLCF that are no longer needed for forest management operations and have the potential to be restored back to forested land. Each road within and around the LLCF has been classified into six categories:

- Deactivate to 4WD → Roads will have water drainage restored as needed and may have culverts removed and/or cross ditches in place.
- Rehabilitate to No Access → Roads will be decompacted with natural drainage patterns restored, and planted. Users will not be able to access these roads with motorized vehicles.
- Rehabilitate to ATV → Portions of the roads will be decompacted and planted while maintaining an access route for ATV/ORV users. Users will only be able to access these roads with ATV/ORV.

Why rehabilitate roads?

- Rehabilitating roads restores natural drainage patterns and improves wildlife habitat.
- Increase in forest cover across the land base.
- To fulfil legal and stewardship obligations of road permit holders where these permits are in place.
